Literacy – Reading

(You must complete this activity)

All children are encouraged to regularly share stories at home. Nursery children are issued school library books of their choice. Reception children are issued with school library books and reading books. Please spend time looking at the books with your child, talking through the pictures, predicting what will happen next, making up the story, etc. Reception children should be reading at least 3 times a week which should be recorded in their reading record. Home reading will be checked every Friday and Dojos will be awarded!

Use a variety of coloured objects from around the home to make up a story.



- Our key focus is your reading home learning – For Reception children, please try to read **AT LEAST** 3 times a week. Reading Dojos will be given when books are changed on a Friday.
- The other activities will help with your topic learning, and you will earn dojo points. You can choose which activities you find the most interesting...or you can do them all!
- Upload photos, videos or voice recordings to your profile on Class Dojo, or send in home learning, and we will share it with the class on a Friday.

Make a colourful collage. You could use bits of old fabric, paper, cardboard, petals, leaves, etc.

Can you draw or paint a picture full of beautiful colours?

Fruit and vegetables are very healthy and come in lot of different colours. Can you make a colourful salad/fruit salad?

Bake some biscuits or cupcakes and colourfully decorate them.

Make different coloured ice-cubes using food colouring. Watch it melt. Do the colours spread?

Go on a colour scavenger hunt. What can you find in our natural world of different colours? You could take photos or draw pictures of the things you see.
